Season of Advent (Year C) Gaudete Week: Our week begins with "Gaudete Sunday." *Gaudete* means "rejoice" in Latin. It comes from the first word of the Entrance Antiphon on Sunday. The spirit of joy that begins this week comes from the words of Paul, "**The Lord is near.**" This joyful spirit is marked by the third candle of our Advent wreath, which is rose/pink coloured. The second part of Advent begins on December 17th each year - this year, in 2012, it is tomorrow Monday in the Third Week of Advent. For the last eight days before Christmas, the plan of the readings changes. The first readings are still from the prophesies, but now the gospels are from the infancy narratives of Matthew and Luke. We read the stories of faithful women and men who prepared the way for our salvation. We enter into the story of how Jesus' life began. These stories are filled with hints of what his life will mean for us. Faith and generosity overcome impossibility. Poverty and persecution reveal glory. Advent is marked by a spirit of expectation, of anticipation, of preparation, of longing expressed in hope for the unfolding day. It is that hope, however faint at times, and that God, however distant He sometimes seems, which brings to the world the anticipation of a King who will rule with truth and justice and righteousness over His people and in His creation.

The colour that shows we await our King. E is for **Effort**. Give it your best to prepare for the Lord. N is for **Nice**. Try to be nice to those around you, remembering that God lives within them too. T is for **Time**. Jesus said "You do not know the day nor the hour your Lord will come". *So let us make the most of the time we have*.

Gaudete Week: The spirit of joy that begins this week comes from the words of Paul, "The Lord is near." <u>Preparing our Hearts and asking for Grace</u>: We prepare this week by feeling the joy.
