**Season of Advent (Year C)** Advent – from the Latin word 'adventus', meaning 'arrival' or 'approach'.

Advent is a time when we prepare to celebrate, once again, the arrival of Jesus into our world and into

our lives. Waiting to celebrate any event involves anticipation, excitement and preparation. Advent is no

different. One of the ways in which we honour this time is through the symbolism of the Advent Wreath.

Celebrating the tension between light and darkness, the advent wreath invites us to notice the areas in

our lives where the light has not yet reached and to notice the light that came into the world with the birth of Jesus.

Shaped in a circle to symbolize the eternity of God, this circular evergreen wreath expresses God's unending love.

MPPC Minutes: 1. Cathal Doherty has designed a new parish website and it will be available before Christmas - and we thank him for the work he has done. It is a work in progress and will be available shortly. 2. 'Sign-up Sunday' to be organised in the spring. 3. Building a Faith Community, Baptism and First Communion Group – recent meeting date did not suit those who were interested in partaking in the training, hence the meeting will now take place in January. 4. Children - Celebrating Advent this event took place last weekend at the Vigil Mass in Aughaclay. Children from the parish schools prepared and participated in the Vigil Mass, and prepared decorations for the Jesse trees – thanks to all who participated and prepared the children. 5. Three Year Formation Programme – Group the Parish Council will have on-going evaluation from the training team. January-March Programme - "Being and Building a Faith Community as a Parish" group will require two members of the MPPC as well as four new members from the parish community. 6. Flower Arrangement - coordination of the flower-arrangers who decorate the sanctuaries for the liturgical seasons of the year. 7. Eucharistic Ministers - There will be a Commissioning Ceremony/Retreat Day in the spring for the Eucharistic Ministers. New Ministers will be required in the New Year. 8. Mass Responses - Parishioners are not speaking out during the Mass, not familiar with responses! We need strategies to improve this. Encourage people to follow texts in Mass sheet. 9. Next meeting will look at better mediums of informing our parishioners and engaging them to become more active in their parish community.

Season of Advent: Advent starts on the fourth Sunday before December 25<sup>th</sup> which is the Sunday from November 27<sup>th</sup> to December 3<sup>rd</sup> inclusive. Christmas always falls on a fixed calendar date – 25<sup>th</sup> December which is a different day each year, unlike Easter which is in effect a moveable Feast but always falls on a Sunday. The season offers the opportunity to share in the ancient longing for the coming of the Messiah, and to be alert for his Second Coming. For Christians, the season of Advent serves as a reminder both of the original waiting by Israelites for the birth of the Messiah, and the waiting by Christians for the return of Christ. The most famous hymn of Advent is "O Come Emmanuel." Its lyrics, based on the Prophet Isaiah, articulate the hopeful anticipation of the Advent season: 'O come, O come, Emmanuel, And ransom captive Israel, That mourns in lonely exile here. Until the Son of God appear. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.'
